Lane Head Farm Bungalow

Demolition of Outbuildings - Archaeology

The South Yorkshire Archaeology Advisory Service, as advisors to the council, have identified archaeological potential relating to early buildings of possible medieval and/or post-medieval date at the Bungalow on Higham Lane, Barnsley.

Initial demolition works at the Site required the removal of the superstructures of two small outbuildings either side of the 1960s bungalow as shown below in early September 2022.

The site was visited after demolition, and we can confirmed there was no evidence of:

- Excavation by machine
- Excavation with hand tools
- Machine scraping of the surface
- Pulling out utilities or foundations
- Pulling out tree stumps or other mature vegetation
- Grubbing out foundations
- Machines sinking into the surface during wet weather

There was no impact on below ground deposits and therefore no effect on any potential archaeology.
