**Proposal** Rebuild and renovation works to agricultural building to convert to one dwelling (Listed Building Consent)


**At** Plot 1, Cart Barn, Oaks Farm, Oak Wood Drive, Darton, Barnsley, S75 8AL

Consent is **granted** for the proposals which were the subject of the Application and Plans registered by the Council on 12 July 2016 and described above.

The consent is subject on compliance with the following conditions:-

- 1 The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of 3 years from the date of this permission.  
**Reason: In order to comply with the provision of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.**
- 2 The development hereby approved shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the plans (Received 1st July 2016) and specifications as approved unless required by any other conditions in this permission.  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with LDF Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**

The grant of this consent does not constitute or imply permission, approval or consent by the Local Authority for any other purpose, whatsoever, including planning permission for the development.

- 3 No development shall take place until there has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, full details of both hard and soft landscaping works, including details of the species, positions and planted heights of proposed trees and shrubs; together with details of the position and condition of any existing trees and hedgerows to be retained. The approved hard landscaping details shall be implemented prior to the occupation of the building(s).  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.**
- 4 All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which die within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development, are removed, or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with other of similar size and species.  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.**
- 5 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order with or without modification), no enlargement, improvement or other alteration of the dwellings which would otherwise be permitted by Part 1 of Schedule 2 to that Order shall be carried out without the prior written consent of the Local Planning Authority, and no garages or other outbuildings shall be erected.  
**Reason: To safeguard neighbouring amenities and the character of the listed building in accordance with CSP30.**
- 6 No development shall take place until full details of the proposed external materials have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**
- 7 Any new or repaired facing stone to the proposed development shall match the existing in terms of colour, general grain size, type of face dressing, and method of coursing.  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**
- 8 All rooflights shall be genuine black conservation rooflights, low in profile with a single vertical divider  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**
- 9 Pointing mix to be lime (NHL 3.5): aggregate at a ratio of 1:3. Sand / aggregate should be well graded or river sand or agreed alternative. Preparation of the joints will require careful removal of cement by hand at a depth equal to twice that of the width. Pointing mix to be of the same colour or as close as possible to the original lime and to be finished slightly back from arms of surrounding stonework and brushed off or stippled to remove laitance and expose aggregate to a depth of 2 or 3 mm.  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**

- 10 All door and window frames shall be timber and be set in at least 75mm of the reveal and have dark oak stain finish (or other agreed).  
**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.**
- 11 The parking/manoeuvring facilities, indicated on the submitted plan, shall be surfaced in a solid bound material (i.e. not loose chippings) and made available for the manoeuvring and parking of motor vehicles prior to the development being brought into use, and shall be retained for that sole purpose at all times.  
**Reason: To ensure that satisfactory off-street parking/manoeuvring areas are provided, in the interests of highway safety and the free flow of traffic and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 26, New Development and Highway Improvement.**
- 12 No development shall take place, including any works of demolition, until a Construction Method Statement has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority. The approved Statement shall be adhered to throughout the construction period. The Statement shall provide for:  
-The parking of vehicles of site operatives and visitors  
-Means of access for construction traffic  
-Loading and unloading of plant and materials  
-Storage of plant and materials used in constructing the development  
-Wheel washing facilities  
-Measures to control the emission of dust and dirt during construction  
-Measures to control noise levels during construction  
**Reason: In the interests of highway safety, residential amenity and visual amenity and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 26, New Development and Highway Improvement, and CSP 29, Design.**
- 13 Construction or remediation work comprising the use of plant, machinery or equipment, or deliveries of materials shall only take place between the hours of 0800 to 1800 Monday to Friday and 0900 to 1400 on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays.  
**Reason: In the interests of the amenities of local residents and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40, Pollution Control and Protection.**
- 14 No development shall take place until:
- (a) Full foul and surface water drainage details, including a scheme to reduce surface water run off by at least 30% and a programme of works for implementation, have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority:
- (b) Porosity tests are carried out in accordance with BRE 365, to demonstrate that the subsoil is suitable for soakaways;
- (c) Calculations based on the results of these porosity tests to prove that adequate land area is available for the construction of the soakaways;
- Thereafter no part of the development shall be occupied or brought into use until the approved scheme has been fully implemented. The scheme shall be retained throughout the life of the development.  
**Reason: To ensure proper drainage of the area in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40, Pollution Control and Protection.**

## NOTES:-

1. If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse listed building consent for the proposed works, or to grant consent subject to conditions, he may appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions in accordance with Sections 20 and 21 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 within six months of receipt of this notice. (Appeals must be made on a form which is obtainable from The Planning Inspectorate, Room 3/24 Hawk Wing, Temple Quay, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN). The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
2. If listed building consent is refused or granted subject to conditions, whether by the local planning authority or the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonably beneficial use in its existing state and cannot be rendered capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted, he may serve on the Council of the district a purchase notice requiring that Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Section 32 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
3. In certain circumstances a claim may be made against the Local Planning Authority for compensation where permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on a reference of the application to him. These circumstances in which such compensation is payable are set out in Section 27 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
