**UXO Preliminary Risk Review**  
**Upper New Street, Barnsley S70 1LQ**

MACC International Ltd (MACC) has conducted a preliminary risk review for the site footprint. The review has drawn on open source and in-house information, references have been provided where available (See Annex A).

The review has been conducted to provide Southern Testing with a review of the risk which may be posed by UXO while conducting investigations on the site.

This document has been produced in the United Kingdom by MACC International Limited and has been provided solely as an aid in decision making. It is not intended to be used by any person for any purpose other than that specified. Any liability arising out of use by a third party of this document for purposes not wholly connected with the above shall be the responsibility of that party, who shall indemnify MACC International Limited against all claims, costs, damages and losses arising out of such use.

No records were found to confirm a bomb strike within the site boundary. Whilst considering the history of the site and the level of post-war development, the following conclusions have been reached:


- It is considered that there is not a credible likelihood of encountering UXO on the plot. Consequently the UXO risk is considered to be LOW within the plot boundary.
- Nevertheless it is recommended that:
  - All site personnel are provided with a UXO Safety Awareness Talk before intrusive works are commenced.

Unexploded Ordnance Preliminary Risk Review

<p><b>Site location</b></p>	<p>Site Address: Upper New Street, Barnsley S70 1LQ          Grid Reference: 434573, 405968</p> 
<p><b>Scope of Intended works</b></p>	<p>Preliminary review of the risk that may be posed by UXO to geotechnical investigations.</p>
<p><b>History</b></p>	<p>There were no bombing decoys in the immediate surrounding area.</p> <p>HAA gun sites were located in the local area to defend against air attack and it is a matter of record that combat engagements with enemy aircraft did take place.</p>
<p><b>Wartime History</b></p>	<p>Records did not confirm a bomb strike within the site footprint. The nearest recorded bombs fell c.a.2.6km west of the site at Dodworth.</p> <p>Barnsley was home to two National Shell Factories. There is some dispute about the exact locations of these as both have been demolished. However, on balance they are likely to have been located to the north east of the site, not within the site footprint.</p>
<p><b>Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) Finds</b></p>	<p>In June 2013 an unexploded WWII bomb was discovered in Dodworth; however no reports were found to indicate that items of UXO have been found within the site footprint.</p>
<p><b>Post War Development</b></p>	<p>The site has undergone significant development since 1945.</p>
