In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby grants consent for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 10 June 2010 and therein described as:- Remove lower limb, shape, crown clean and thin Ash Tree (T1) within TPO 4/2000. 47 Nether Royd View, silkstone Common, Barnsley, S754QQ.

Consent is subject to compliance with the following conditions:-

- 1 Not less than five working days notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998.  
**Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice in accordance with Policy GS22 of the adopted Unitary Development Plan and SPG9 (Trees and Hedgerows).**
- 2 The proposed tree works should be completed within 2 years of the date of this consent.  
**Reason: To ensure that adequate notice is given for the works to be inspected and approved by the Local Planning Authority.**
- 3 No more than 30% of the current total leafing area is to have been removed upon completion of all works.  
**Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice in accordance with Policy GS22 of the adopted Unitary Development Plan and SPG9 (Trees and Hedgerows).**
