Noise	Noise in the immediate area will be increased during opening hours.	Noise from customers will be controlled by specifying opening and closing times. Doors and windows will generally be closed to reduce noise during later opening hours.	The noise created from the store will attract new people to the area, therefore more customers for other local businesses. Increase in employment opportunities in the local area.
Odour	The products used in the shop can create an unwanted odour. However the smell of the food from the store will counteract the bad odours.	A discharge device will be installed to counteract the odours. This will be designed with a grease filter and high point of discharge.	The food scent will positively impact the area as it adds an inviting smell to the store and shop front. i.e. fresh bread, ground coffee

Contaminated land e.g. disposal of oil	Oil can contaminate areas if not correctly disposed of.	The waste oil will be recycled, proper care will be taken to ensure that it is stored separately from the rest of the takeaway waste, in a sealed container. This prevents the oil leaking and causing damage to the environment.	Waste being correctly disposed of will increase the hygiene of the shop along with the cleanliness and tidiness. Increase in the use of spent oil being used as oil derived fuel. HVO biofuels.
Air Quality	Due to the cooking equipment in the store, air quality could be compromised without the correct systems in place.	Any machine outlets will be correctly positioned leading out of the store and will come equipped with high efficiency air pollution control equipment to remove oily fumes. Grease filters will be in use and all equipment will be frequently cleaned.	To keep a high standard of air quality, the store will be well ventilated.
Litter	There is a possibility of people dropping packaging or food bought from the shop.	A bin will be installed both inside and outside of the store as an incentive for people not to litter.	Due to an extra bin being located, it may also encourage not only people from the shop not to litter but also people who haven't bought food from the shop but are passing by. Event/ match day staff will complete a pick of the area once fans have dispersed and discard any and all litter found (even if not created initially by our operations)
Anti-social behaviour	Increased footfall in the immediate area.	Anti-social behaviour which primarily takes place during later hours, opening hours will be specified to restrict this behaviour. Increased footfall and public presence will decrease anti-social behaviour/ opportunist/ surveillance crimes.	CCTV in place will be used in general to monitor the shop surroundings. Therefore if the footage is required for any other purpose (e.g. break in/antisocial behaviour) it will be available.
Healthy Eating	Often takeaways can be associated with unhealthy food. This can cause health issues including obesity.	The food served will fall within all guidelines for intake. Healthier food options will be equally advertised giving people the choice of a healthy meal.	Our aim is to serve healthy and appealing food options made with local ingredients to encourage healthy eating and reduce the risk of health issues.

Working Conditions	Good working conditions will be a big priority. The aim is to ensure people are in a safe and comfortable working environment.	Cleaning will be done on a regular basis with suitable and safe products. Ventilation will be installed to allow a suitable and comfortable working temperature.	Employment opportunities combined with training and upskilling opportunities will be beneficial to local residents. Consistent cleaning will reassure people that the store is serving safe food products.
Accidental injury & public safety	Due to more activity in the area, the risk of injury will rise. The possibility of an individual requiring first aid attention is still unlikely.	A first aid kit and fire extinguisher will be present in the store. This will allow a quick response to any injury increasing public safety.	Due to the presence of a first aid kit and fire extinguisher, unrelated matters to the store can also be assisted. This increases the general safety measures in the area. We will be working along with other local business to look into providing a defibrillator also.
