Proposed Tree Works Application

1. Site Address & Tree Identification

Species: Common Ash (*Fraxinus excelsior*)

Protection Status: Subject to Tree Preservation Order (TPO).

2. Description of Proposed Works

The application seeks permission for a heavy crown reduction and removal of major limbs overhanging the garden.

Specific Action: Removal of primary lateral limbs extending over the southern/western [choose one] aspect of the garden.

Target: Reducing the weight of the canopy by approximately [e.g., 30-40%] to mitigate the risk of branch failure.

Ivy Removal: Severing of ivy at the base to allow for a full aerial inspection of the main stem and crown.

3. Statement of Reasons for Work

The works are proposed due to a combination of physiological decline and safety concerns:

Ash Dieback (ADB) Infection: The tree is exhibiting clear symptoms of Ash Dieback, including sparse foliage in the upper canopy and necrotic lesions. Ash trees with ADB are known to become brittle rapidly, significantly increasing the risk of "drop-out" for heavy limbs.

Safety & Hazard Mitigation: The major limbs currently overhang a high-usage garden area. Given the progressive nature of ADB, reducing the weight and lever-arm effect on these limbs is a necessary preemptive measure to protect people and property.

Heavy Ivy Colonization: The tree is currently obscured by dense ivy from the base to the upper canopy. This adds significant "sail area" (wind loading), increasing the risk of wind-throw or limb snapping during storms. Furthermore, the ivy prevents a thorough safety inspection of the bark and structural junctions.

4. Arboricultural Standards

All works will be carried out in accordance with BS 3998:2010 (Tree Work – Recommendations). Pruning cuts will be made to appropriate growth points to maintain the health of the remaining structure and minimize the entry of further decay pathogens.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
 - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)

If it is impossible to identify the tree(s) accurately on the plan (e.g. because they are part of a woodland or group of trees), please identify their approximate location on the plan and provide details of how the tree(s) are marked on site (e.g. high visibility tape, tree tags, paint, etc); trees must not be marked by scarring or cutting into the bark.
