DESCRIPTION Erection of Innovation Centre (BBIC) with a mix use of offices and workshop units with associated car parking and landscaping

LOCATION Innovation Way, Wilthorpe, Barnsley, S75 1JL

Permission is granted for the proposals which were the subject of the Application and Plans registered by the Council on 06 June 2017 and described above.

The approval is subject on compliance with the following conditions:

- 1 The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of 3 years from the date of this permission.
Reason: In order to comply with the provision of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- 2 The development hereby approved shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the plans and specifications as approved unless required by any other conditions in this permission:

Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with LDF Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.



- 3 Upon commencement of development details of the proposed external materials shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.
- 4 Construction or remediation work comprising the use of plant, machinery or equipment, or deliveries of materials shall only take place between the hours of 0800 to 1800 Monday to Friday and 0900 to 1400 on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
Reason: In the interests of the amenities of local residents and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40, Pollution Control and Protection.
- 5 No development shall take place, including any works of demolition, until a Construction Method Statement has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority. The approved Statement shall be adhered to throughout the construction period. The Statement shall provide for:
- The parking of vehicles of site operatives and visitors
 - Means of access for construction traffic
 - Loading and unloading of plant and materials
 - Storage of plant and materials used in constructing the development
 - The erection and maintenance of security hoarding including decorative displays and facilities for public viewing, where appropriate
 - Wheel washing facilities
 - Measures to control the emission of dust and dirt during construction
 - Measures to control noise levels during construction
- Reason: In the interests of highway safety, residential amenity and visual amenity and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 26, New Development and Highway Improvement, and CSP 29, Design.**
- 6 Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015 (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order with or without modification), no building or structure shall be placed or erected within 3 metres, measured horizontally, of any sewer or culverted watercourse.
Reason: To prevent damage to the existing [sewer, watercourse or culverted watercourse] in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40, Pollution Control and Protection.
- 7 No development or other operations being undertaken on site shall take place until the following document has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority:
- Tree protection plan
Tree Protection Barrier Details
Arboricultural method statement
- Thereafter, no development or other operations shall take place except in complete accordance with the approved methodologies. The erection of barriers and any other measures specified for the protection of any retained tree shall be undertaken in accordance with the approved plans and particulars before any equipment, machinery or materials are brought on to the site for the purposes of the development, and shall be maintained until all equipment, machinery and surplus materials have been removed from the site. Nothing shall be stored or placed in any area fenced off in accordance with this condition and the ground levels within those areas shall not be altered, nor shall any excavation be made, without the written consent of the Local Planning Authority.
- Reason: To ensure the continued well being of the trees in the interests of the amenity of the locality.**

- 8 Upon commencement of development, full details of both hard and soft landscaping works, including details of the species, positions and planted heights of proposed trees and shrubs; together with details of the position and condition of any existing trees and hedgerows to be retained shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The approved hard landscaping details shall be implemented prior to the occupation of the building(s).
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.
- 9 All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the buildings or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which die within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development, are removed, or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with other of similar size and species.
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.
- 10 Prior to commencement of development full details of the mitigation measures identified in the Ecological Impact Assessment (Prepared by Access Ecology) dated April 2017), including a timetable for their implementation, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be implemented in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: To conserve and enhance biodiversity in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36.
- 11 Prior to occupation of the building/commencement of the use, full details of any security lighting shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Details shall include the location, orientation, angle and luminance of the lighting. The approved details shall be implemented prior to occupation of the building/commencement of the use and retained as such thereafter.
Reason: To protect the amenity of existing and future occupiers from glare and/or nuisance light in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40.
- 12 The proposed development shall achieve BREEAM standard of 'very good' or equivalent. Upon completion of the development, an energy performance certificate shall be provided to the Local Planning Authority demonstrating that the required standard has been achieved and the measures provided to achieve the standard shall be retained as operational thereafter.
Reason: In the interest of sustainable development, in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP2.
- 13 Upon commencement of development, details of a scheme to reduce the developments carbon dioxide emissions by at least 15% by using decentralised, renewable or low carbon energy sources or other appropriate design measures shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details and upon completion of the development a report shall be submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority demonstrating that at least a 15% reduction in carbon dioxide emissions has been achieved. In the event that the use of other decentralised, renewable or low carbon energy sources or other appropriate design measures are also required to achieve a 15% reduction in carbon dioxide emissions, full details of such proposals and a timetable for their implementation shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority prior to installation. The approved details shall be implemented in accordance with the approved timetable and all the approved measures shall be retained as operational thereafter.
Reason: In the interest of sustainable development, in accordance with Core Strategy policy CSP5.

- 14 Upon commencement of development details of measures to facilitate the provision of high speed broadband for the development hereby permitted, including a timescale for implementation, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: In order to ensure compliance Core Strategy policy CSP 42, policy I1 in the emerging Local Plan and in accordance with paragraphs 42 and 43 of the National Planning Policy Framework.


Informative(s)

Pursuant to article 31(1)(cc) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with our Planning Service Charter for Business and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application.

Please be aware that the Council monitors construction sites and open land within the vicinity such sites in an attempt to prevent fly tipping (i.e. unauthorised deposit of waste on land), which is illegal under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The penalties for fly-tipping can include:

- *a fine of up to £50,000 and*
- *up to six months imprisonment on conviction*

Therefore, if necessary, please ensure that all demolition waste and waste associated with the construction of the approved development is disposed of via approved methods and that documents are retained to prove this.

NOTES:-

Appeals to the Secretary of State

If you are aggrieved by the decision of the Council to grant permission for the proposed development subject to conditions then you can appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act. If you want to appeal, then you must do so within six months of the date of this notice, using a form which you can get from The Planning Inspectorate, Room 3/24 Hawk Wing, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN.

The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions it imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order and to any directions giving under the order. In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based its decision on a direction given by him.

Purchase Notices

If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor can he render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted. In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Compensation

In certain circumstances compensation may be claimed from the Local Planning Authority if permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on reference to the application to him. These circumstances are set out in Sections 114 and related provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
