In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby refuses consent for the Display of non illuminated free standing directional sign (Resubmission) Deangate Care Centre, Towngate, Mapplewell, Barnsley, S75 6AT in accordance with the application form and accompanying plan(s) registered by the Council on 20 April 2009.

The reasons for the Council's decision to refuse consent are:-

- 1 In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the proposed directional sign would materially harm the appearance of the street scene, by reason of its design, siting and undue prominence and therefore would be contrary to Policy BE6D of the approved Barnsley Unitary Development Plan and the Council's Supplementary Planning Guidance Note 8

If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the Local Planning Authority to refuse consent the applicant may within eight weeks of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions in accordance with Regulation 22 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1984. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of notice of appeal in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the Local Planning Authority in regard to the proposed display are in progress.
