## 1.0 Consultation Summary

BCS, in conjunction with its partners, have undergone an extensive consultation process in developing the designs to their current position. The main consultees include:

1. The Clients, Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council (BMBC) and NHS Barnsley.
2. Staff Groups
3. Barnsley Design Review Panel
4. Patient Groups
5. Local communities
6. Barnsley Planning and Development Control
7. Other Statutory bodies

Upon gaining confirmation that the outline designs substantially met the client's requirements, the scheme proposals were presented to the Barnsley Design Review Panel, which is made up of representatives from local renowned design advisory bodies/companies, community representatives, artwork enablers and planners. The design review panel made recommendations for all four sites which were all, in the main, taken on board and designs amended accordingly (in consultation with BMBC Planning).

Following on from the above, the consultation was extended to include staff groups. The purpose of this consultation was to ensure that the designs were functional in terms of service delivery and access to services. The main focus was on room layouts, size and location of rooms, interdependencies between rooms/departments, access and car parking strategies. Staff group consultation will be extended into the detailed design process and will concentrate on all aspects of building design including detailed room layouts, furniture layouts, positions of mechanical and electrical services etc.

At this stage the building floor plans had evolved to an advanced design stage but external enveloping and landscaping designs were limited. BCS then actively engaged with the local communities, on the design proposals, via locally based road shows, workshops and walkabouts (designed and developed in conjunction with BMBC and NHS Barnsley). The consultation events were very popular and well attended by all representatives from the local communities. The consultation events focussed on:

1. Building appearance and sense of place
2. Internal communal/community spaces
3. Traffic, access, parking and landscaping
4. Historical interest
5. Opening times and operational Issues
6. Community artwork Project
7. Future consultation

A canvassing sheet was used to document and collate the views and aspirations of the local communities and the proposed designs were reviewed against these, in consultation with recommendations from Planning/Development Control, the Design Review Panel, staff groups and the Clients. The external enveloping design was progressed taking into account all of the above.

The local communities' views and aspirations were documented and collated via canvassing sheets (designed in consultation with BMBC and BPCT) and the design proposals reviewed against these and the results of the consultation received from the Clients, Design Review Panel and Planning Department.

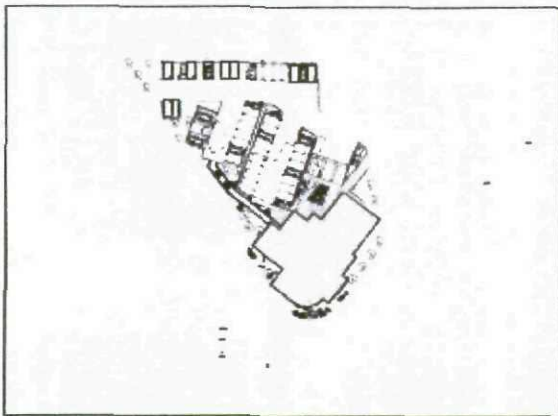
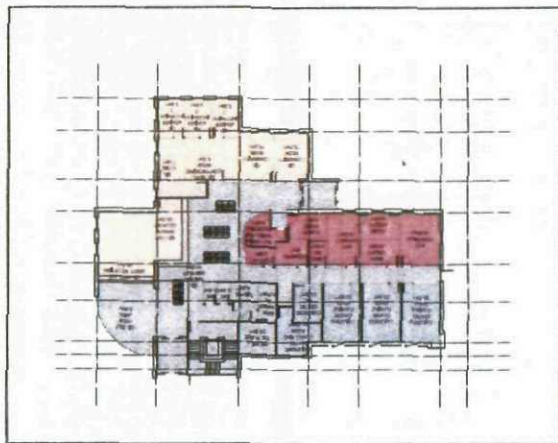
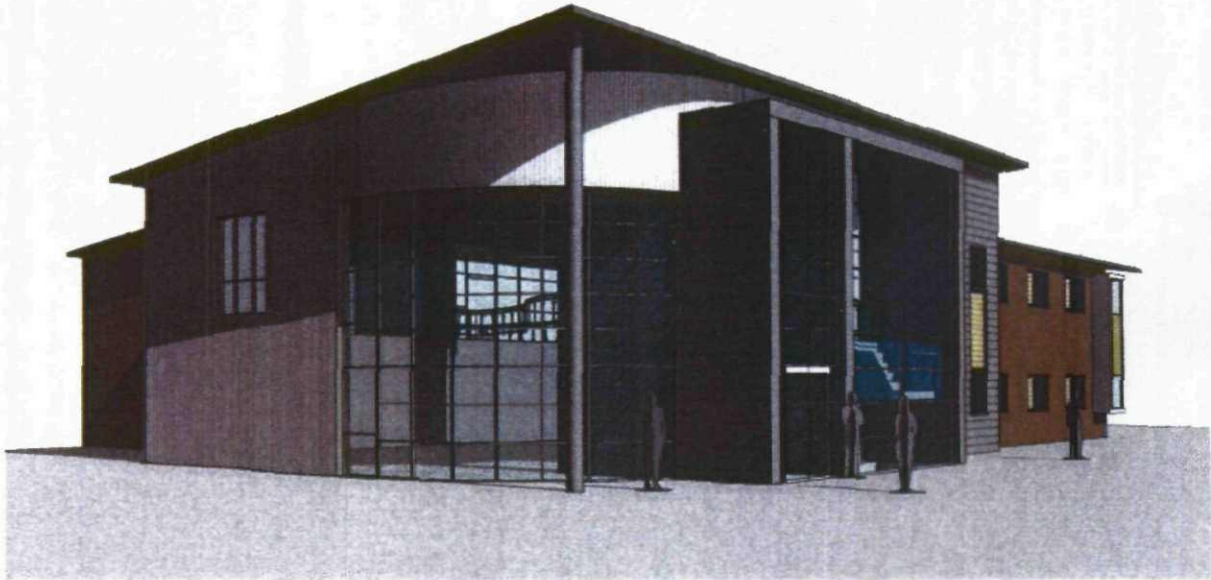
The community consultation process will be extended into the detailed design process by the formation of sub-groups which will focus initially on material choice and colours of external walls but this will be extended to include internal communal areas and community artwork projects.

Barnsley Planning Authority, Development Control and other Statutory bodies have been consulted throughout design development.

In summary, the current design proposals have evolved taking in account the consultation outlined above. The consultation process has not concluded and will continue throughout the detailed design stages of these projects.

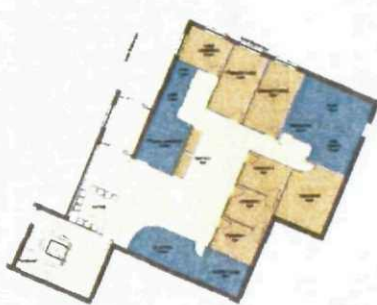
## 2.0 Consultation and Design Evolution

### 2.1 Darton Proposals Prior to Consultation:

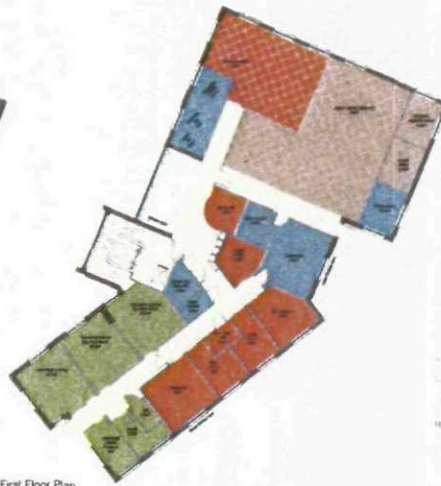


Prior to undertaking the consultation discussed above, the Darton proposals were very different to those currently proposed, both in terms of building location and internal and external design.

Ground Floor Plan



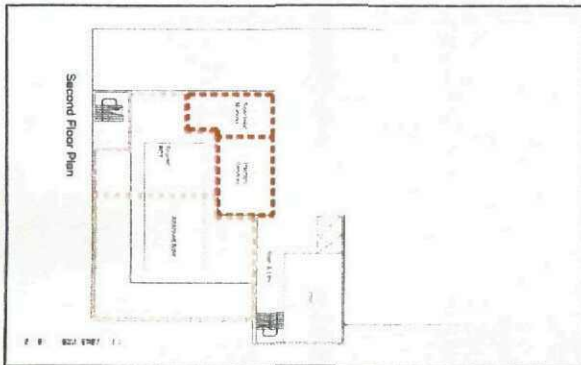
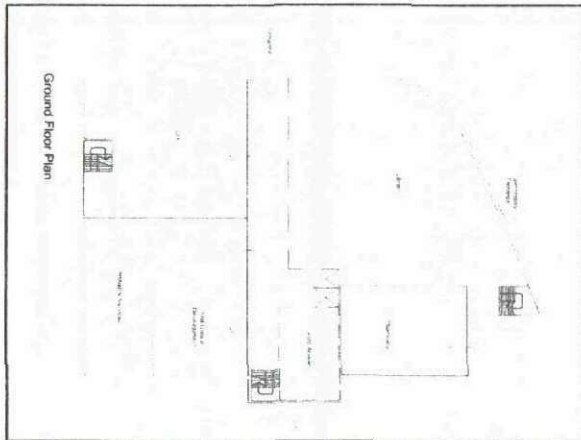
First Floor Plan

**2.3 Hoyland Proposals Prior to Consultation:**



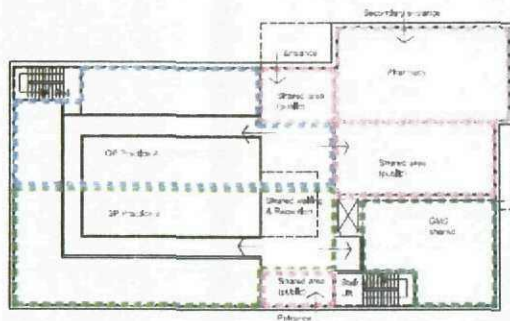

## 2.4 Current Hoyland Proposals

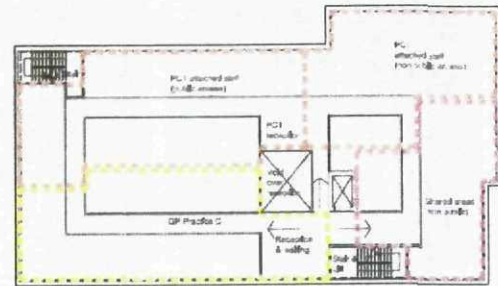


In the current design the building has been 'broken up' externally to give it a scale more relative to its surroundings. The central garden feature adds natural lighting and ventilation to the centre of the building. GP accommodation is now located on the ground floor and the main access point is on the side facing the proposed new town square. External elevation treatments are still to be finalised in consultation with the community.

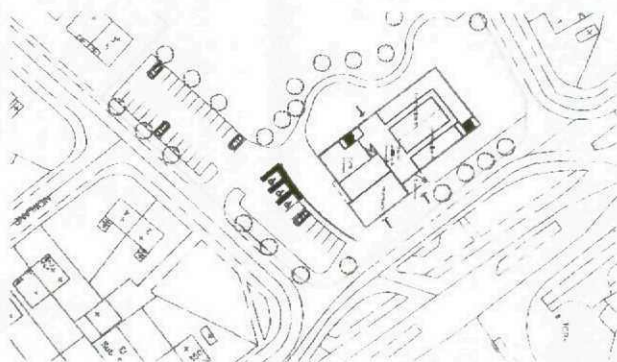

First Floor Plan

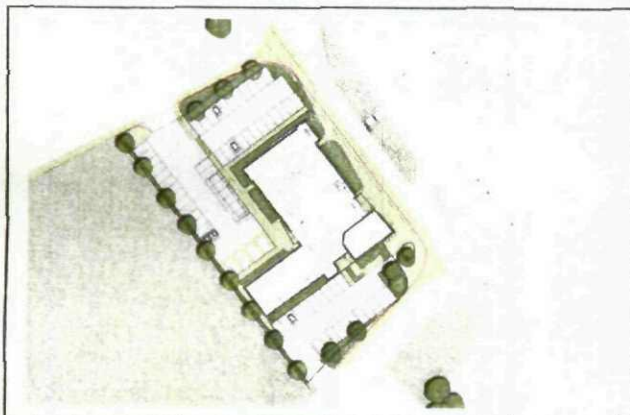
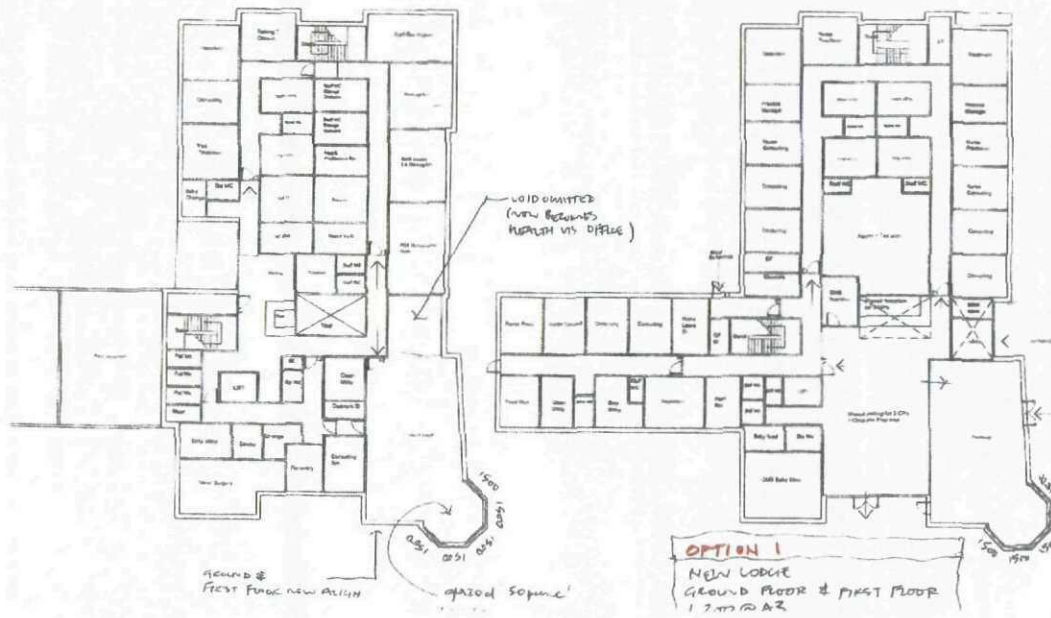

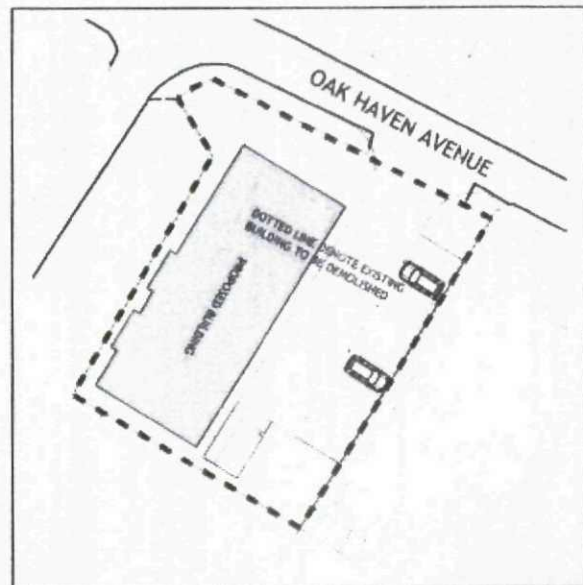
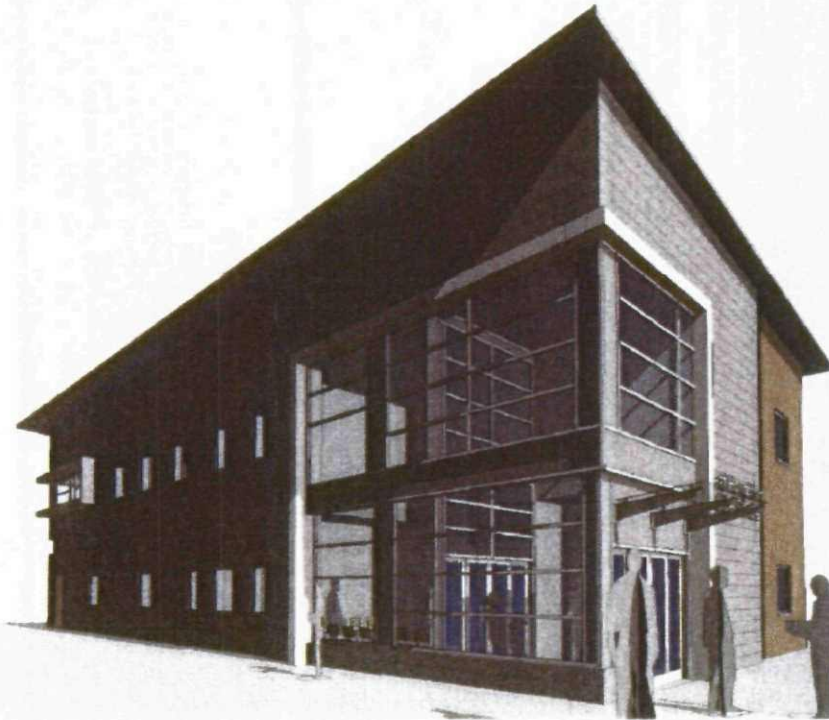


## 2.6 Current New Lodge Proposals



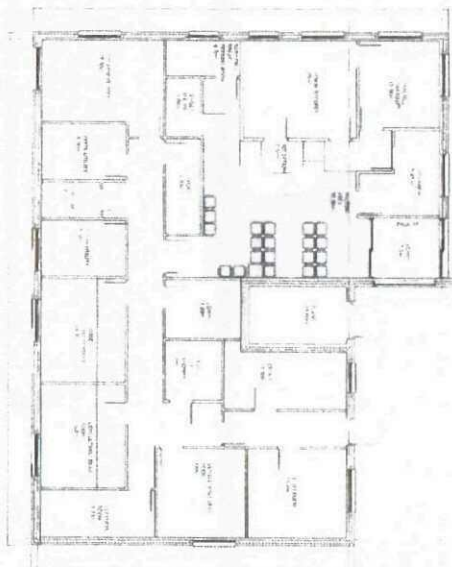
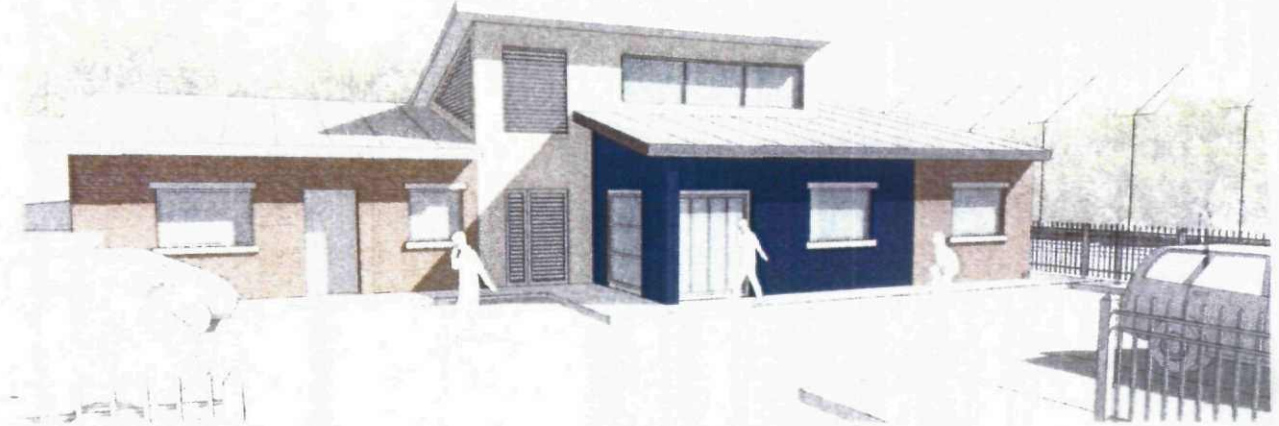
The current proposals include all GP accommodation on the ground floor and the addition of a minor surgery suite. The building position and site boundary has changed to suite the requirements of the Design Review Panel, Planners and New Lodge Steering Group. Internal circulation and waiting areas have been improved with the addition of a double height glazed spaced linking all functional area. External material colours to be finalised in consultation with the community.

**2.7 The Great Houghton Proposals Prior to Consultation:**



Prior to undertaking the consultation above, the Gt Houghton design was two storeys with the building orientated in a North Easterly direction.

## 2.8 Current Great Houghton Proposals

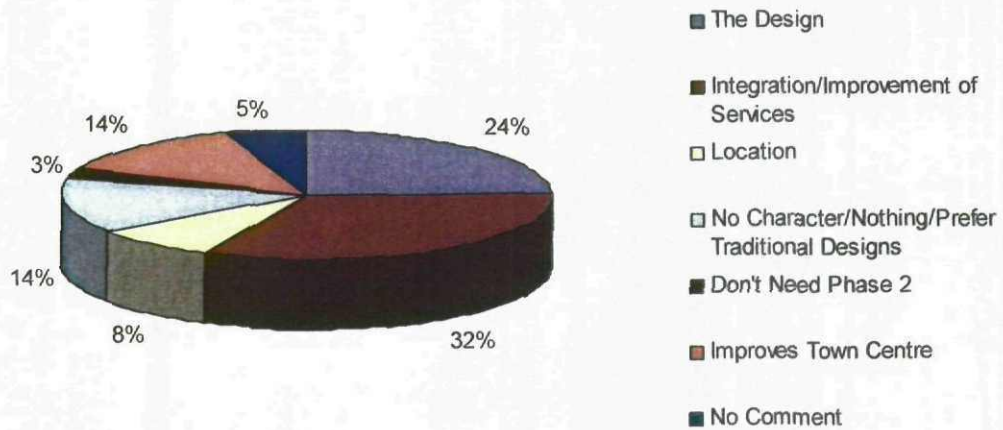


Through the consultation process, the NHS Barnsley commissioning strategy was amended resulting in a smaller facility. Also the building form has become more residential to fit in with its surroundings. The position of the building on the site has also changed to enhance external landscaping and car parking facilities.

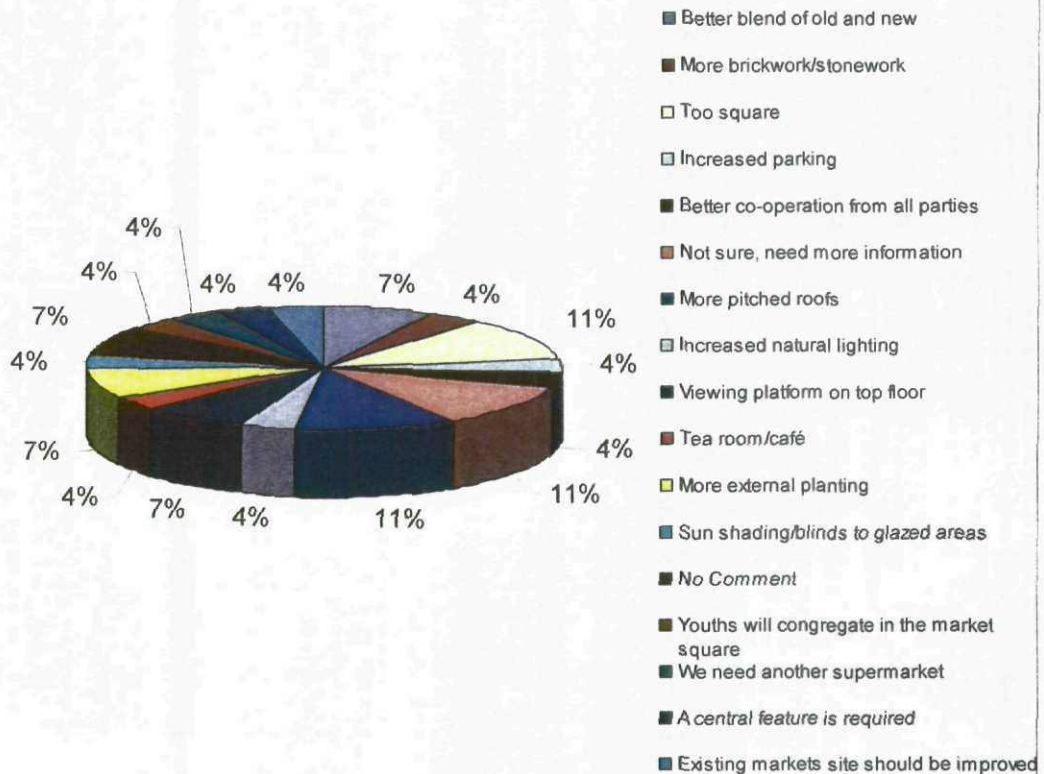
