We are proposing a change of use of an existing garage to form a beauty salon business. There are no extensions or external alterations proposed beyond the replacement of the garage doors. The proposal also includes for the installation of a new half bathroom within the garage footprint. The current make up of the garage front is two brickwork columns supporting a timber frame wall construction with cladding to the front exterior plus the garage door.

The proposed beauty business is an existing business that is looking to relocate to the applicant home premises. The business currently and would continue

to operate on a 1:1 appointment basis, with no walk-ins, during the following times:

The garage front is constructed by two brickwork columns supporting the garage door, with a timber cladding solution above the garage door. Externally, surrounding the garage door is white cladding.

Proposed materials and finishes:

The proposed construction after removing the garage door would be to continue with timber cladding construction, supporting a new door and window. Externally we would again continue with the cladding finish - Colour TBC. Internally we would be proposing a timber framed partition wall to form the new water closet within the current garage footprint.
