TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREE PRESERVATION ORDER) REGULATIONS 1969

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby **grants consent** for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 23/11/2020 and therein described as:-

**Remove and replace Ash trees T1 and T2 and Yew tree T4 and remove epicormic growth from Ash tree T3 within TPO 9/1978**

**Darley House, Pantry Hill, Worsbrough Bridge, Barnsley, S70 4RP**

The approval is subject on compliance with the following conditions:

1	The proposed tree works should be completed within 2 years of the date of this consent. <b>Reason: To ensure that adequate notice is given for the works to be inspected and approved by the Local Planning Authority.</b>
2	Not less than five working days notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998. <b>Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice.</b>

3 Within the first planting season the two Ash trees and Yew tree to be removed shall be replaced by a new Weeping Lime (*Tilia tomentosa* 'Petiolaris'), a new Oak tree (*Quercus robur*) and a new Hornbeam (*Carpinus betulus* 'fastigiata'). These shall be planted in suitable locations as close as possible to the tree removed which they replace.

Specification: Heavy standard sized trees shall be planted and affixed (with flexible tree ties) to a tanalised tree stake (minimum diameter 75mm) at a height of no more than 1m above ground level. In order to aid establishment a suitable mulch shall be applied (e.g. semi-composted woodchip to a minimum depth of 75mm) around the trees to a radius of 1m. Trees shall be watered immediately after planting then whenever required to ensure successful establishment. Within two weeks of planting the Local Authority Tree officer shall be informed and invited to inspect the new tree. The new trees shall be subjected to a Tree Preservation Order in replacement of the felled trees. Any tree which fails to become established within 5 years from planting shall be replaced with another tree of the same original specification.

**Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality.**

## **Informative(s)**

*Pursuant to article 31(1)(cc) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with our Planning Service Charter for Business and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application.*

- 1 The granting of planning permission does not in any way infer that consent of the landowner is given. Therefore the consent of all relevant landowners is required before proceeding with any development including that of the Council as landowner.

- 2 The granting of planning permission does not effect the status of species such as owls and bats which have protection under other legislation. These may be present, and it is the applicant's responsibility to seek advice on how to avoid damaging operations. *Please be aware that the Council monitors construction sites and open land within the vicinity such sites in an attempt to prevent fly tipping (i.e. unauthorised deposit of waste on land), which is illegal under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The penalties for fly-tipping can include:*

- up to six months imprisonment on conviction.
