I am seeking planning permission to safely fell the mature Sycamore tree located within my garden due to significant concerns regarding property safety, proximity, and local amenity impact. The justification for this request is outlined below:

1. Structural Proximity & Risk to Property

The tree is a very large specimen situated approximately 8 meters from the main residential property. Given its significant height, canopy spread, and mature weight, any structural failure, root heave, or limb drop poses a direct and catastrophic threat to the structural integrity of my home. Due to this close proximity, a total failure of the tree in high winds would result in severe destruction of the property.

2. General Public Amenity and Local Impact

While I appreciate the value of urban greenery, this specific tree has outgrown its current residential setting, leading to sustained issues for the immediate neighborhood:

Loss of Light: The sheer size and dense canopy of the Sycamore cause severe shadowing, blocking natural daylight from neighboring gardens and windows.

Seasonal Nuisance: I receive regular and consistent complaints from neighboring residents regarding the heavy, continuous drop of leaves and honeydew sap, which impacts their properties and outdoor spaces.

3. Mitigation and Replanting Plan

To ensure there is no net loss to local biodiversity or the green canopy of the area, I propose a high-quality replacement. I intend to plant a Rowan (Mountain Ash) tree in a suitable location within the garden.

This will permanently resolve the proximity and light issues for both my property and the neighbors, while ensuring the local environment continues to thrive.

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This will permanently resolve the proximity and light issues for both my property and the neighbors, while ensuring the local environment continues to thrive.
