During works, construction or demolition related activity shall only take place onsite between the hours of 0800 to 1800 Monday to Friday and 0900 to 1400 on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays

Deliveries to the development during operation shall only be carried out between the hours of 07:00 and 17:00 hours, with the exception of emergency situations.

Consultation Informative(s):

It is recommended that measures are taken to prevent a nuisance/or affect the quality of life of local residents.
