DESCRIPTION Erection of 1 no. detached dwelling.
LOCATION Somerlees, Lane Head Road, Cawthorne, Barnsley, S75 4AA

Permission is granted for the proposals which were the subject of the Application and Plans registered by the Council on 03 December 2012 and described above.

The approval is subject on compliance with the following conditions:

- 1 The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of 3 years from the date of this permission.
Reason: In order to comply with the provision of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- 2 The development hereby approved shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the plans (Nos LOC 01, 01, 02, 03 Rev C, 04, 05 and Tree Survey dated 19th January 2013) and specifications as approved unless required by any other conditions in this permission.
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with LDF Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.
- 3 No development shall take place until full details of the proposed external materials have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 29, Design.
- 4 Construction or remediation work comprising the use of plant, machinery or equipment, or deliveries of materials shall only take place between the hours of 0800 to 1800 Monday to Friday and 0900 to 1400 on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays.
Reason: In the interests of the amenities of local residents and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 40, Pollution Control and Protection.

The grant of this consent does not constitute or imply permission, approval or consent by the Local Authority for any other purpose.

- 5 The parking/manoeuvring facilities, indicated on the submitted plan, shall be surfaced in a solid bound material (i.e. not loose chippings) and made available for the manoeuvring and parking of motor vehicles prior to the development being brought into use, and shall be retained for that sole purpose at all times.
Reason: To ensure that satisfactory off-street parking/manoeuvring areas are provided, in the interests of highway safety and the free flow of traffic and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 26, New Development and Highway Improvement.
- 6 All planting, seeding or turfing comprised in the approved details of landscaping (including the tree planting proposed on plan number 03, revision C) shall be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the building or the completion of the development, whichever is the sooner; and any trees or plants which die within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development, are removed, or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with other of similar size and species.
Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.
- 7 Prior to the commencement of development or other operations being undertaken on site in connection with the development, the following documents prepared in accordance with BS5837 (Trees in Relation to Construction 2005: Recommendations) shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority:
- Root protection areas (RPA)
 - Tree constraints plan (TCP)
 - Tree protection plan (TPP)
 - Arboricultural implication assessment (AIA)
 - Arboricultural method statement (AMS)
 - Details of no-dig construction proposals for areas of car park and drive including cross-sections and plans showing relevant area.
- No development or other operations shall take place except in complete accordance with the approved methodologies.
Reason: To ensure the continued well being of the trees in the interests of the amenity of the locality.
- 8 No hedges or trees on the site (except those shown to be removed on the approved plan), or their branches or roots, shall be lopped, topped, felled, or severed. If any retained tree is removed, uprooted or destroyed or dies, another tree shall be planted at the same place and that tree shall be of such a size and species, and shall be planted at such time, as may be specified in writing by the Local Planning Authority.
Reason: To safeguard existing trees/hedges, in the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP 36, Biodiversity and Geodiversity.
- 9 Full details of the window design, construction and finish (including details of heads and cills, means of opening and glazing pattern) shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before the commencement of the relevant site works. The details shall include an elevation at 1:20 scale of each door or window type and 1:5 scale cross-sections. Development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: To protect or improve the character and appearance of the area in accordance CSP 29 of the Barnsley Core Strategy.

- 10 All doors to be used in the construction of the building shall be constructed in timber with garage doors in vertically boarded timber in a dark colour. Full details of their design, construction and finish (including details of any door surrounds) shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before the commencement of the relevant site works. The details shall include an elevation at 1:20 scale of each door or window type and 1:5 scale cross-sections. Development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.
Reason: To protect or improve the character and appearance of the area in accordance CSP 29 of the Barnsley Core Strategy.
- 11 The dwelling shall achieve Code Level 3, in accordance with the requirements of the Code for Sustainable Homes: Technical Guide (or such national measure of sustainability for house design that replaces that scheme). No dwelling shall be occupied until a Final Code Certificate has been submitted to the Local Planning Authority certifying that Code Level 3 has been achieved.
Reason: In the interest of sustainable development in accordance with Core Strategy Policy CSP2

Appeals to the Secretary of State

If you are aggrieved by the decision of the Council to grant permission for the proposed development subject to conditions then you can appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act. If you want to appeal, then you must do so within six months of the date of this notice, using a form which you can get from The Planning Inspectorate, Room 3/24 Hawk Wing, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN.

The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions it imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order and to any directions giving under the order. In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based its decision on a direction given by him.

Purchase Notices

If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor can he render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted. In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Compensation

In certain circumstances compensation may be claimed from the Local Planning Authority if permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on reference to the application to him. These circumstances are set out in Sections 114 and related provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
