TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREE PRESERVATION ORDER) REGULATIONS 1969

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby grants consent for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 05 October 2015 and therein described as: - Ash Tree to be removed for health and safety reasons as part of the River Restoration Project within W2 of TPO: 4/1958. Off Mill Lane, Ingbirchworth, Barnsley, S36 7GG.

Consent is subject to compliance with the following conditions:-

- 1 Within the first planting season following the completion of the removal of the Ash tree it shall be replaced by a new Ash tree (*Fraxinus excelsior*). The new tree shall be planted within 2m of the current location of the tree it will replace and to the following specification:

Specification: A heavy standard tree (Girth of 12 to 14cm) of the species mentioned above shall be planted and affixed (with flexible tree ties) to a tanalised tree stake (minimum diameter 75mm) at a height of no more than 1m above ground level. In order to aid establishment a suitable mulch shall be applied (e.g. semi-composted woodchip to a minimum depth of 75mm) around the tree to a radius of 1m. The trees shall be watered immediately after planting then whenever required to ensure successful establishment. Within two weeks of planting the Local Authority Tree officer shall be informed and invited to inspect the new tree. The new tree shall be subjected to a Tree Preservation Order in replacement of the felled tree. Any tree which fails to become established within 5 years from planting shall be replaced with another tree of the same original specification.

Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and continuance of the tree cover of the local area.

- 2 The proposed tree works should be completed within 2 years of the date of this consent. Any required replanting should be carried out in the planting season immediately following the tree felling.
Reason: To ensure the works applied for remain appropriate to the condition of the trees at the time of the work.
- 3 Not less than five working days notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998.
Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice.

- 1 Before proceeding with the notified works, you should ensure that you have the permission of the owner, and comply with all other relevant legislation, for example it is an offence to disturb nesting birds, and bat roosts.

If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the Local Planning Authority to grant consent subject to conditions, he may appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions in accordance with Section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, within 28 days of receipt of this notice.
