TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREE PRESERVATION ORDER) REGULATIONS 1969

To Mr Daniel Humphries 1 Church View Worsbrough Barnsley S70 4FB

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby **grants consent** for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 21/08/2024 and therein described as:- Crown thin by 20% and crown lift to 5m the four trees marked on the plan within TPO 5/1974 (Amended Description). 1 Church View, Worsbrough, Barnsley, S70 4FB.

The approval is subject on compliance with the following conditions:

- The proposed tree works should be completed within 2 years of the date of this consent. Reason: To ensure that adequate notice is given for the works to be inspected and approved by the local planning authority.
- 2 Not less than five working days' notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998.

Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice.



Informative(s)

Pursuant to article 35 (2) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2015 (as amended), the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a preapplication advice service available, and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application in a positive and proactive manner.

- The granting of planning permission does not in any way infer that consent of the landowner is given. Therefore, the consent of all relevant landowners is required before proceeding with any development, including that of the Council as landowner.
 - If it should transpire that the applicant does not own any of the land included in this consent, then it is the responsibility of the applicant to seek all necessary consents and approvals of the landowner.
- 2 Before proceeding with the notified works, you should ensure that you have the permission of the owner, and comply with all other relevant legislation, for example it is an offence to disturb nesting birds, and bat roosts.
- A public right of way runs alongside the proposed area of tree removal. Safe public access on the right of way should remain available whenever possible, with no obstruction of or encroachment onto the width of the path and no building debris, storage of materials or parked vehicles limiting access at any time. Appropriate measures should be taken to protect the public, including fencing if necessary. If safe public access is not possible at any time then a temporary closure must be arranged, providing at least 4 weeks' notice and details of how public access will be managed. Please be aware that the Council monitors construction sites and open land within the vicinity of such sites in an attempt to prevent fly tipping (i.e. unauthorised deposit of waste on land), which is illegal under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The penalties for fly-tipping can include:

- a fine of up to £50,000 and
- up to six months imprisonment on conviction.

Therefore, if necessary, please ensure that all demolition waste and waste associated with the construction of any development is disposed of via approved methods and that documents are retained to prove this.
