We live directly behind the proposed boundary separating the new and old properties, and are concerned by the fact that our one story bungalow will be overlooked by three-story houses. This is compounded by the fact that the new houses are on a considerable higher ground level than our property — which will make the over-looking problem even worse.

Please see below the statement contained in your letter —

We can only take into account planning matters. For example, this might include the effect of the proposal upon the enjoyment of your home or garden; on the appearance of the surrounding area; and on highway safety. In contrast, we cannot take into account matters such as the effect of the proposal on individual property values, ownership disputes or issues covered by other legislation.

This statement will be directly contravened by the new development, ie the enjoyment of our home and garden —

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
