In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby refuses consent for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 22 March 2010 and therein described as:- Felling of Beech Tree T1 within TPO 4/2008

The reasons for the Council's decision to refuse consent for the proposal are:-

- 1 In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the proposed felling of the Beech tree which is subject to a Tree Preservation Order (TPO No.4/2008) would be harmful to the visual amenity of the area, contrary to UDP Policy GS22.
