DESCRIPTION Erection of single storey side and rear extensions

LOCATION Flash House Farm, Lane Head Road, Cawthorne, Barnsley, S75 4AJ

Permission is **granted** for the proposals which were the subject of the Application and Plans registered by the Council on 03/09/2020 and described above.

The approval is subject on compliance with the following conditions:

1	The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of 3 years from the date of this permission. Reason: In order to comply with the provision of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
2	The development hereby approved shall be carried out strictly in accordance with the amended plans (Nos. 20808103RevA and 20808101RevC) and specifications as approved unless required by any other conditions in this permission. Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality in accordance with Local Plan Policy D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.
3	External wall and roof materials shall match the existing or historic materials in every respect and no construction work will commence until a representative sample of all new external materials has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority, and the development shall proceed in strict accordance with these details as approved. Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.

4	<p>The facing stone shall be natural delph sandstone, matching the existing in terms of colour, general grain size, type of face dressing, and method of coursing. Coursing will be in squared off blocks with split and lightly dressed faces, no greater than 150mm to match the main barn.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>
5	<p>The roof shall be covered with natural sandstone roofing slate laid in diminishing courses.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>
6	<p>Rooflights to be genuine conservation style rooflights, with black framing, a single vertical divider, and low profile.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>
7	<p>The mortar mix for works shall be 1:3 (1 part NHL3.5 lime: 3 parts washed river or grit sand), this should be flush pointed than stippled back to reveal the texture of the aggregate and the arises of the stone blocks by a couple of millimetres.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>
8	<p>All windows to be used in the construction of the building shall be constructed in either timber or metal / aluminium PPC. Full details of their design, construction and finish (including details of heads and cills, means of opening and glazing pattern) shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority before the commencement of the relevant site works. The details shall include an elevation at 1:20 scale of each door or window type and 1:5 scale cross-sections. Development shall be carried out in accordance with the approved details.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>
9	<p>Doors shall be in timber and the frame shall be mounted in a minimum of 75mm in the reveal.</p> <p>Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality and in accordance with Local Plan Policy HE3 Developments affecting Historic Buildings and D1 High Quality Design and Place Making.</p>

Informative(s)

NOTES:-

Appeals to the Secretary of State

If you are aggrieved by the decision of the Council to grant permission for the proposed development subject to conditions then you can appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act. If you want to appeal, then you must do so within six months of the date of this notice, using a form which you can get from The Planning Inspectorate, Room 3/24 Hawk Wing, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN.

The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal. The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions it imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order and to any directions given under the order. In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based its decision on a direction given by him.

Purchase Notices

If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor can he render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted. In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Compensation

In certain circumstances compensation may be claimed from the Local Planning Authority if permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Secretary of State on appeal or on reference to the application to him. These circumstances are set out in Sections 114 and related provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
