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## 1 Executive Summary

1.1 This Travel Plan (TP) seeks to encourage residents of the development to use alternative sustainable means of travel instead of single occupancy car trips for the journey to work.

1.2 The key actions arising from this plan are:-

A Travel Plan Co-ordinator will be appointed by the Developer. The Travel Plan Co-ordinator (TPC) will be in place when the development is first marketed. The TPC will undertake the specific tasks outlined in this Travel Plan.

The TPC will undertake a travel survey of residents to establish current travel patterns after occupation of approximately 30% of the total number of dwellings. However, a travel survey questionnaire will be included in the residential Welcome Pack and purchasers will be asked to complete the survey when they first occupy their property.

The TPC will prepare an updated Travel Plan after the initial travel survey has been conducted and analysed. The Travel Plan shall review the measures and targets and shall be submitted to and approved by Barnsley Council.

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## 2 Introduction

- 2.1 Sanderson Associates (Consulting Engineers) Ltd has been appointed by Keepmoat Homes Ltd to prepare a Travel Plan in support Phase 3 of the proposed residential development at the School Street site in Thurnscoe, Barnsley. A site location plan is included at **Appendix A, (Figure 1)**.
- 2.2 This Travel Plan follows on from, and should be read in conjunction with, the approved Travel Plan (report ref: 10082/002/01) submitted as part of the Phase 2 / 3 Hybrid application (LPA ref: 2017/1051).
- 2.3 In accordance with Local and National Government Policies to protect and enhance the environment and to reduce reliance on the private car, this Travel Plan assesses the current situation in the vicinity of the site, and proposes initiatives and measures to encourage accessibility via a variety of transport modes. This Travel Plan includes:
- Clear and unambiguous objectives to influence a lifestyle less dependent upon the private car;
  - A package of measures to encourage and facilitate less car dependant living; and,
  - A time bound programme of implementation.
- 2.4 This Travel Plan will be further developed following discussions with the Local Authority, and other relevant bodies, once the site is occupied and specific travel needs are identified.
- 2.5 Prospective residents of the site will be made fully aware of the commitment of the development towards the use of sustainable transport. At the earliest possible stage they will be provided with detailed information which sets out the intentions of the Travel Plan and its obligations on future residents. This will be achieved by including a copy of the Travel Plan within the sales / marketing suite and providing a Welcome Pack (see sample in **Appendix B**) within the sales particulars for each plot.

- 2.6 Information regarding the Travel Plan will be included on the sales website for the development.
- 2.7 This Travel Plan also sets out the facilities which will be incorporated into the development to encourage future occupiers to use sustainable transport along with the initiatives that should be adopted by residents.

### 3 Travel Plan Objectives

3.1 The Travel Plan will include realistic and appropriate objectives and targets for the life of the plans operation. Travel Plans exist to influence a shift in behaviour towards more sustainable methods of travel using a mixture of increased transportation opportunity, providing information, persuasion and incentives.

3.2 The Travel Plan objectives are as follows:

- To minimise single occupancy vehicle trips on the journey to work that are created by the site; and
- To encourage residents to travel by sustainable modes.

3.3 The Transport Assessment which accompanies the planning application sets out trip rates and generations for the likely peak hour periods. The tables below show the trip generations and modal split for the proposals.

3.4 Based on the TRICS data, Phase 3 of the development could be expected to generate 22.8% of trips by walking, cycling and public transport modes in the AM peak hour and 14.8% in the PM peak hour. Over a 24 hour weekday period 18.9% of travel could be by sustainable modes.

- 3.5 This modal split has been compared to the 2011 Census travel to work data for the Barnsley 014 MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) in which the site is located, Barnsley and England, as summarised in the following table:

- 3.6 The data in the table above indicates that in the Barnsley 014 MSOA, 73.1% of people travel to work in a car or van, of which 63.5% are drivers and 9.6% are passengers, while 21.4% of people travel to work by more sustainable means.
- 3.7 The Census information indicates that 63.5% of people could be expected to drive to work by a car or van, which is lower than the Barnsley average. Therefore it is considered that this would be an appropriate initial target for the modal split for the scheme over the life of the Travel Plan.
- 3.8 The setting of future targets will be subject to the results of the initial and future travel surveys as clearly the 'base' modal splits will have a fundamental impact on the setting of realistic targets and the proportion of the proposed shift to more sustainable modes of transport. Targets will be agreed with Barnsley Council as part of the refinement process of the Travel Plan, following the results of the initial surveys.

- 3.9 In order to establish the 'base' situation, resident travel surveys will be undertaken once 30% of the development is occupied. The completed surveys will be collated and the results provided to Barnsley Council. After that date subsequent surveys will be undertaken on an annual basis.
- 3.10 Annual monitoring of the effectiveness of the initial measures contained within the Travel Plan can identify examples of good practice. These can be refined over time to provide every opportunity to achieve the targets, once set.
- 3.11 If the targets identified are not met (once the travel surveys have been examined), the Travel Plan Co-ordinator will further promote and encourage sustainable modes of transport by use of 'mailshots' and advertising campaigns / events.
- 3.12 An action plan will be prepared and agreed with the Local Planning Authority's Travel Team. The Action Plan will contain an annual program of measures designed to help achieve the Travel Plan targets on travel mode share. It will clearly set out the tasks involved, the person(s) responsible, and dates by which the measures will be achieved over the next 12 months.

## 4 Travel Plan Roles and Responsibilities

- 4.1 It is generally accepted that the success of a Travel Plan relies heavily on the appointment of a Travel Plan Co-ordinator (TPC) whose duties normally include liaison with Residents, Local Authority and Local Transport Operators. Keepmoat Homes will be responsible for appointing the TPC whose contact details are: The Waterfront, Lakeside Boulevard, Doncaster, DN4 5PL. Tel: 01709 766 000.
- 4.2 The role of TPC is unlikely to require a full time equivalent position. The TPC will act as a point of contact and will oversee the implementation, operation and monitoring of the Travel Plan.
- 4.3 The TPC will be in post 3 months prior to first occupation and will contact Barnsley Council on appointment to advise that work has commenced on delivering the Travel Plan and any change in contact details will also be passed to Barnsley Council.
- 4.4 The TPC will work closely with the developer to ensure that all occupiers of the development receive sustainable travel information at the point of occupation.
- 4.5 The duties of the TPC include:
- Leading on the delivery of the Travel Plan once approved or, if appointed earlier, inputting to its formation;
  - Representing the 'human face' of the Travel Plan - explaining its purpose and the opportunities on offer. The Co-ordinator will also play a central role in liaison with residents, steering groups, management committees and Barnsley Council;
  - Provide personalised travel planning tailored to resident's needs (or procuring this service from others);
  - Promoting the individual measures in the Travel Plan;
  - Liaising with public transport operators - it is helpful if Co-ordinators initiate contact early on to enable bus and train operators to brief them about services and fares. At a later point, the Co-ordinator can also feedback residents' opinions to the operators;

- Ensuring the approved Travel Plan and its component parts are being actioned;
- Monitoring the travel plan implementation;
- Taking a key role in review of the travel plan.

4.6 The TPC role will be provided for a five year period from post completion of the development to undertake the specific tasks outlined in this TP.

4.7 As part of this procedure it is particularly important that residents and visitors are made aware of the sustainable transport alternatives that are available and of any aspects of the site's infrastructure that have been designed to assist and encourage their use.

4.8 This Travel Plan contains specific measures designed to meet the needs of the occupants and thus attempt to influence the travel modes of residents and visitors to reduce the numbers of car-borne trips to and from the development.

4.9 The Travel Plan shall be monitored and reviewed annually. Travel questionnaires (see sample at **Appendix C**) shall be carried out upon initial occupation by using the documents to be provided in the residents Welcome Pack. The results shall be collated by the TPC when 30% of the total dwellings have been occupied and the results provided to Barnsley Council. Travel surveys will then be repeated annually until 5 years from the completion of the development.

4.10 A written analysis of each set of survey results shall be provided to the Council within 3 months of the completion and collation of the surveys. This will include a monitoring report which includes all the survey data, any proposed revisions to the Travel Plan and the annual action plan for the next 12 months.

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## 5 Accessibility by Non-Car Travel Modes

### 5.1 *Introduction*

5.1.1 This section comprises an assessment of accessibility for the proposed development which relates to the following categories:

- Walking
- Cycling
- Public Passenger Transport – Bus and Train facilities and services

### 5.2 *Walking*

5.2.1 Walking is the most important mode of transport at the local level and can replace short car trips in journeys under 2km, which contribute to congestion and pollution, as well as the need for car parking. Walking is the most sustainable form of transport and provides one way of reducing pressure on the environment. People walking are also travelling at a pace that gives them a greater connection with their surroundings and can have positive benefits in relation to a community's security through increased surveillance.

5.2.2 Walking stimulates both personal health and the health of communities and local economies. Government health improvement advice states that just 30 minutes brisk walking 5 times a week can bring about significant reductions in the risk of coronary heart disease, high blood pressure and diabetes.

5.2.3 In relation to acceptable walking distances Manual for Streets, offers the following guidance in Section 4.4 “The Walkable Neighbourhood”

5.2.4 “4.4.1 Walkable neighbourhoods are typically characterised by having a range of facilities within 10 minutes’ (up to about 800m) walking distance of residential areas which residents may access comfortably on foot. However, this is not an upper limit and PPG 13 states walking offers the greatest potential to replace short car trips, particularly those under 2 km. MfS encourages a reduction in the need to travel by car through the creation of mixed-use neighbourhoods with interconnected street patterns, where daily needs are within walking distance of most residents”.

5.2.5 **Appendix A (Figure 2)** indicates destinations which lie within an 800m and 2km radius of the centre of the application site. It is noted that walking routes will not follow the simple radius of this plan and the plan is provided as an indication of where destinations lie and the general extent to which the local area can be accessed on foot. The following amenities and facilities are all located within walking distance of the site.

- Bus stops along School Street, Lingamore Leys, Merrill Road and Houghton Road.
- Thurnscoe Village and associated shops and amenities
- Thurnscoe Train Station
- Gooseacre Primary Academy, The Robert Ogden Special, The Hill Primary Academy, Highgate Primary Academy, Sacred Heart Roman Catholic Primary and Dearne Goldthorpe Primary Schools
- ASDA Supermarket
- Lidget Lane Industrial Estate
- The Thurnscoe Centre doctors surgery
- Weldricks Pharmacy
- Post Office
- Thursncoe Lifelong Learning Centre and Library
- Thurnscoe Sports Ground
- Hickleton Golf Club
- Pheonix Park

5.2.6 In terms of pedestrian infrastructure; the site is located in a predominately residential area therefore extensive pedestrian provision is present in the vicinity of the site, all nearby roads have footways on both sides and are lit. Houghton Road provides the main link between the site and the amenities available in Thurnscoe Village, dropped crossings and central refuge islands are provided regularly along Houghton Road, notably in the vicinity of the junctions with School Street and Merrill Road, with a Zebra crossing provided in the village centre.

5.2.7 Additionally there is a pedestrian bridge over the railway line on the sites eastern boundary which connects the site to the residential estate to the east of the site.

5.2.8 Furthermore the development proposals include for the provision of new footways to be constructed within the site which link to the existing network.

5.2.9 It is considered that the site is therefore well located to allow pedestrian access to local services/ facilities and various places of education and employment.

### **5.3 *Measure in relation to walking facilities***

5.3.1 Pedestrian routes are proposed within the site layout. These will be monitored to identify if further improvements are needed.

5.3.2 The TPCs will promote the benefits of walking in relation to general health and well-being and will promote walking to residents.

5.3.3 The Travel Plan Co-ordinators will advise residents that information regarding walking is available from various websites such as The Walking for Health website [www.walkingforhealth.org.uk](http://www.walkingforhealth.org.uk) and this will be supported within the Welcome Pack and other promotional material.

5.3.4 When an appropriate number of dwellings are occupied, the Travel Plan Co-ordinator can establish demand for parents and children wishing to walk to nearby schools. It is now normal practice for Education Authorities to devise school Travel Plans and the Travel Plan Co-ordinator will consult with the local schools to determine what measures will be incorporated in the Residential Plan for the housing development to compliment the school's plan. These measures may for example be to establish a 'walking bus' or "walking buddies" schemes for a safe commute to nearby schools.

### **5.4 *Cycling***

5.4.1 Cycling also has the potential to substitute for short car trips, particularly those under 5km, and to form part of a longer journey by public transport. The plan at **Appendix A (Figure 3)** shows a 5km radius from the centre of the site, which indicates the extent to which the local area can be accessed on cycle.

5.4.2 Like walking, cycling has an important part to play in reducing congestion, improving accessibility and reducing pollution. Destinations within a 5km radius from the centre of the site are indicated below together with the cycle time based on a 12kph cycle speed.

5.4.3 Within a 5km cycling distance of the centre of the site there are therefore a number of local centres which provide a comprehensive range of services and facilities, a range of school provision and an array of employment opportunities.

## **5.5 Measure in relation to cycle facilities**

5.5.1 Residents will have the opportunity to store cycles within the curtilage of their own property.

5.5.2 Information for cyclists including details of routes, cycle training and details of cycle facilities will be included within the residents Welcome Pack. Further information on cycling can be found at the following websites:

- 5.5.5 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator will promote the benefits of cycling in relation to general health and well-being and will promote cycling to residents within the Welcome Pack.
- 5.5.6 The TPC will promote cycle events such as National Bike Week.

## **5.6 Bus Facilities**

- 5.6.1 There are bus stops located on Lingamore Leys and School Street as shown on **Figure 4, Appendix A**. The facilities provided along with the available services are provided below:-

5.6.3 There are approximately 4 regular services available per hour during weekday peak periods, the majority of which connect to either Barnsley or Doncaster city centres where an array of facilities and employment opportunities are available.

## **5.7 Measures in Relation to Bus Facilities**

5.7.1 Information about all available forms of public passenger transport including routes and destinations, service frequencies, locations of nearest bus stops and sources of other travel information shall be provided within the Welcome Pack. In addition, the physical connections from the site to these facilities will be identified and made known to all residents upon occupation. As mentioned previously it will be the responsibility of the Travel Plan Co-ordinator to ensure that this information is kept up-to-date.

5.7.2 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator will advise occupants that information is available via the internet and up to date bus timetables can be found at <http://www.travelsouthyorkshire.com/> or [www.traveline.org.uk](http://www.traveline.org.uk).

5.7.3 Coach Information can be found at [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com) and Megabus at [www.megabus.com](http://www.megabus.com).

5.7.4 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator will advise residents that real time bus information is available at <http://www.nextbuses.mobi/>.

5.7.5 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator will also approach local bus operators prior to occupation of the development to determine whether operators will be willing to provide additional discounted tickets as an incentive to utilise public transport.

## **5.8 Rail Facilities**

5.8.1 The nearest station to the site is Thurnscoe Train Station, which is located approximately 525m south east of the site. The station is managed by Northern and is accessible by foot and cycle. Facilities at the station include CCTV monitored cycle stands with parking provision for 8 cycles, a 60 space car park and ramps for train access.

5.8.2 A summary of the available services and their frequencies are shown in the following table:

## **5.9 Measure in relation to rail facilities**

5.9.1 Information about all available forms of public passenger transport including routes and destinations, service frequencies, locations of nearest train stops and sources of other travel information shall be obtained from the public transport executive and displayed on notice boards within each element of the development. As mentioned previously it will be the responsibility of the Travel Plan Co-ordinators to ensure that this information is kept up-to-date and reported in each review.

5.9.2 A comprehensive journey planner is available from South Yorkshire Travel which offers travel information for both local and regional travel. The website can be found at the following address:

## **5.10 Motorcycling and Mopeds**

5.10.1 There are several benefits that may be derived from the use of this form of travel. Motor cycles by their very size create less congestion and are more likely to have less environmental impact than a single occupancy vehicle.

5.10.2 Concern is however often raised over the safety of these vehicles and it is therefore important that any promotion of this form of travel includes the need to inform prospective riders of their statutory obligations to obtain proper training by a recognised training organisation or trainer and the correct protective equipment before use of the vehicle.

### **5.11 *Electric Vehicles***

5.11.1 Connections compatible with electric vehicle charging points will be provided within each dwelling.

### **5.12 *Car Sharing***

5.12.1 The site is accessible to the local and wider highway network and the initial Resident Travel Survey will identify the numbers of residents travelling with another. It may be that subject to survey and analysis this figure can be increased with consequent benefits for the environment.

5.12.2 Existing Car Share schemes will be promoted to further encourage car sharing. Further detail can be found at <https://liftshare.com/uk>.

5.12.3 Car Share schemes:

- Provide a cheap way to get around
- Reduce levels of traffic and congestion
- Reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions and pollution
- Reduce parking problems
- Create opportunities for business and the local community to work together
- Create opportunities to meet other people from the local area
- Improve relations with the local community

**5.13      *Reducing the Need to Travel to Work***

5.13.1      It may be possible for residents to encourage their employers to permit some degree of "home working". This of course will be dependent on the particular circumstances of both the resident and the employer and realistically may not be appropriate in many cases. However if "home working" were possible on only a regular single day of the week this could possibly produce a 20% reduction in single car use for an individual resident.

**5.14      *Marketing and Communication Strategy***

5.14.1      All prospective residents will be made aware of both the opportunities that will be available for alternative sustainable travel and of the likely measures to be included within this Travel Plan by providing each unit with a Welcome Pack. Release of this information in the sales particulars of each plot prior to occupation will ensure that all purchasers will be aware of the availability and benefits of sustainable transport at the point of occupation.

5.14.2      Travel information details will be provided on the Keepmoat Homes website for the development.

5.14.3      Residents moving from the development will be obliged to inform the Travel Plan Co-ordinator so that a resident's pack can be provided to the new occupiers, by the Travel Plan Co-ordinator, at the point of reoccupation.

5.14.4      A "mail shot" will be produced by the Travel Plan Co-ordinator at the time of each review which will include the latest information on bus, rail, walking, cycling car sharing arrangements and residents will be encouraged to make this information available to their visitors.

5.14.5      Barnsley Council and Public Transport Executives are able to provide, posters, leaflets and timetables for display on notice boards / display units in communal areas.

5.14.6 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator will promote local and national sustainable travel events to residents. Internet forums such as a Facebook page, a development intranet etc. will be investigated to encourage residents to interact and share and discuss travel arrangements.

5.14.7 The Travel Plan Co-ordinator's contact information including a telephone number and email address will be included within the Welcome Pack to allow residents to contact the TPC.

**5.15 Other Measures**

5.15.1 All residents will be made aware of home shopping and internet shopping within mailshots. These measures assist in reducing the need to travel. Taxis can be used for local shopping trips and short journeys.

5.15.2 Each dwelling will accommodate a phone line which, if the network permits will allow occupants to access the internet and utilise the above mentioned websites to access bus timetable information etc.

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## 6 Enforcement and Monitoring

- 6.1 The operation of this Travel Plan is likely to be a planning obligation related to the planning consent for the development.
- 6.2 It is the responsibility of Sanderson Associates to provide the developer with a copy of the approved Travel Plan. It is then the Developers responsibility to appoint a Travel Plan Co-ordinator when the development is first marketed so that information for residents can be prepared. The name of the Travel Plan Co-ordinator must be forwarded to Barnsley Council as soon as the appointment is made. It is the developer's responsibility to make any prospective purchaser of the site fully aware of the Travel Plan.
- 6.3 With respect to timescales, the Travel Plan will be monitored and reviewed as detailed in Chapter 4. Each annual review after occupation of 30% of the dwellings and the base line survey shall include a resurvey of travel patterns by undertaking a travel questionnaire. A written analysis of each review shall be provided to the Local Authority by the Travel Plan Co-ordinator within 3 month of the completion and collation of the review for the life of the Travel Plan.
- 6.4 The annual surveys shall include details of the monitoring process undertaken. This report should also contain reference to any outside influence, such as changes in occupancy of the dwellings and changes to bus / train services or places of work and schools.
- 6.5 The Travel Plan will be reviewed in co-operation with the Local Authority and if targets have not been met an Action Plan prepared and agreed. The Action Plan will contain a programme of measures designed to help achieve the Travel Plan targets on travel mode share. It will clearly set out the tasks involved, the person(s) responsible, and dates by which the measures will be achieved.

6.6 The developer and the appointed Travel Plan Co-ordinator will use their reasonable endeavours to ensure that the Travel Plan is successful. Finally, the Travel Plan Co-ordinator maintains responsibility for distributing information and promoting the Travel Plan.

6.7 A table summarising how the Travel Plan will be delivered with actions, timescales and who is responsible can be found below:

## 7 Summary

- 7.1 This Travel Plan sets out a series of measures which will encourage changes in the travel patterns of residents and their visitors to the development from use of the single occupancy private vehicle to more sustainable forms of transport.
- 7.2 The Travel Plan includes reference to compliance and enforcement of the Plan and to the required monitoring, review and reporting for the life of the Plan.
- 7.3 It is considered that these measures will help to reduce the reliance on the private car, particularly single-person trips in the peak hours. In turn the numbers of trips by other modes of transport should increase thereby contributing to an improvement in both the operation of the local highway network and in the general environment.
- 7.4 Keepmoat Homes Ltd is committed to encouraging positive changes to the modes of transport used in connection with this development. These measures will help the viability and attractiveness of the overall site to the benefit of all occupiers.
- 7.5 This Travel Plan will be further developed in conjunction with Barnsley Council once the development is operational and specific travel needs are identified.

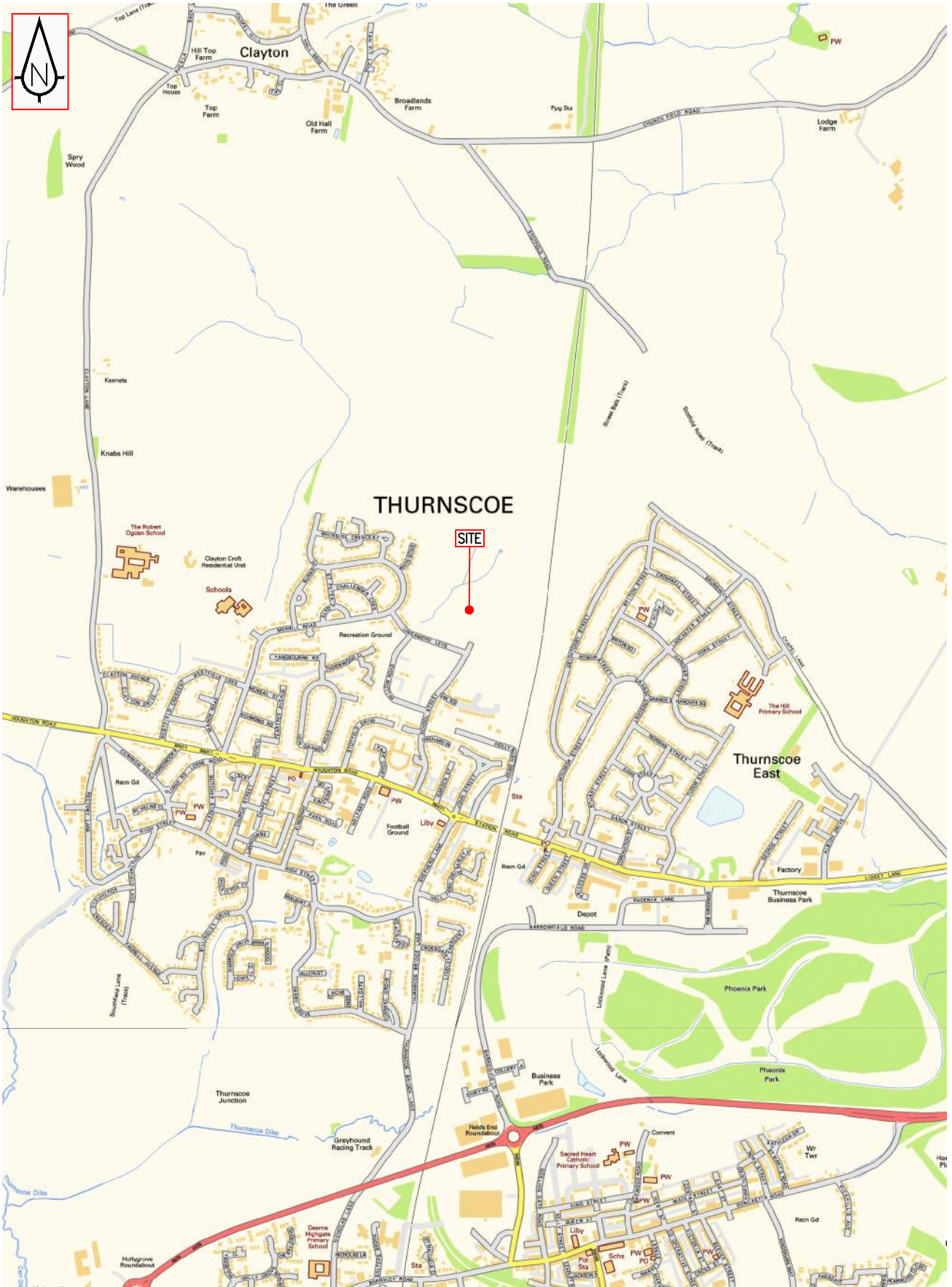
***Figure 1 – Site Location***

***Figure 4 – Location of Public Transport***


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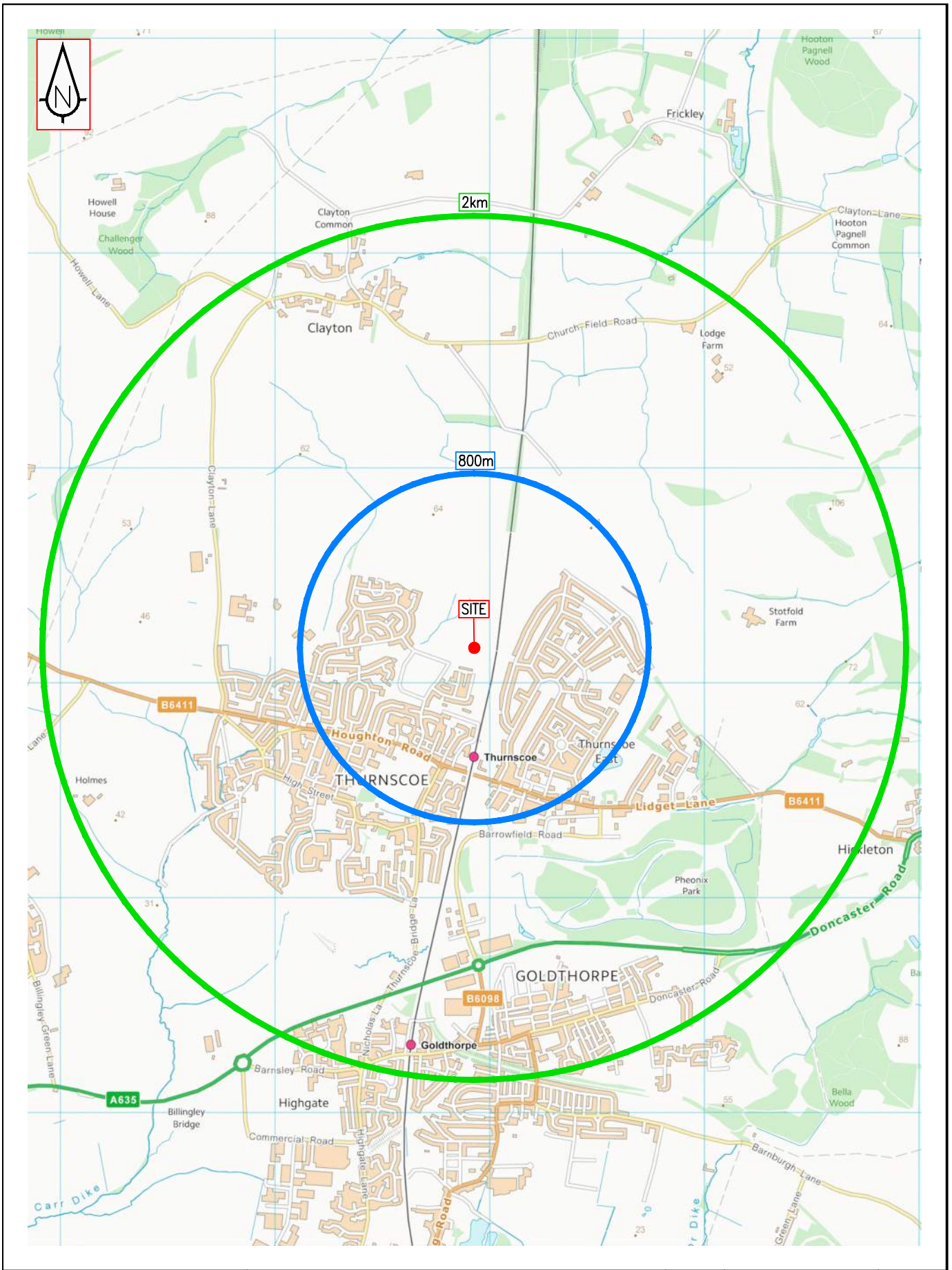



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### Site Location Plan

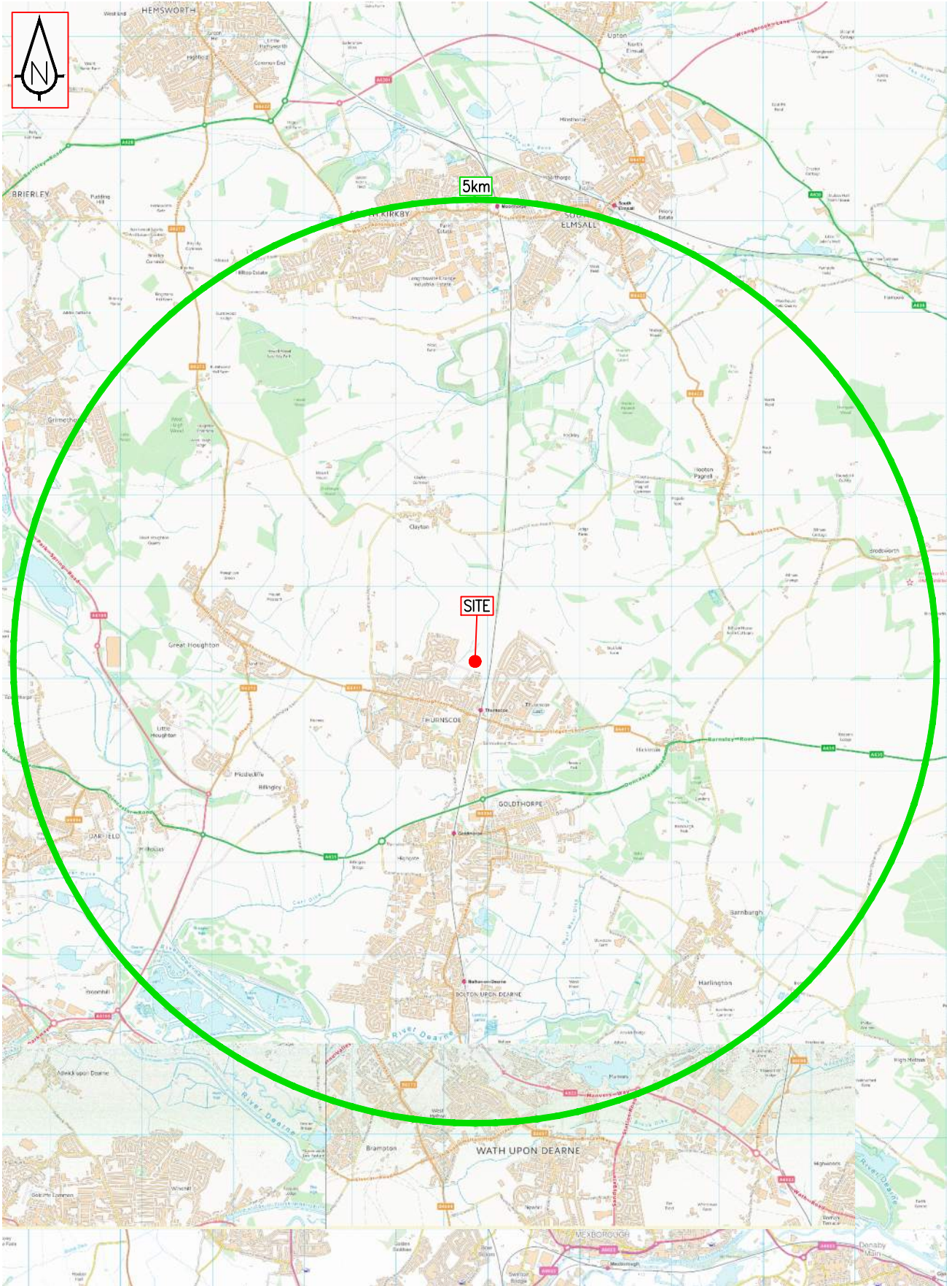

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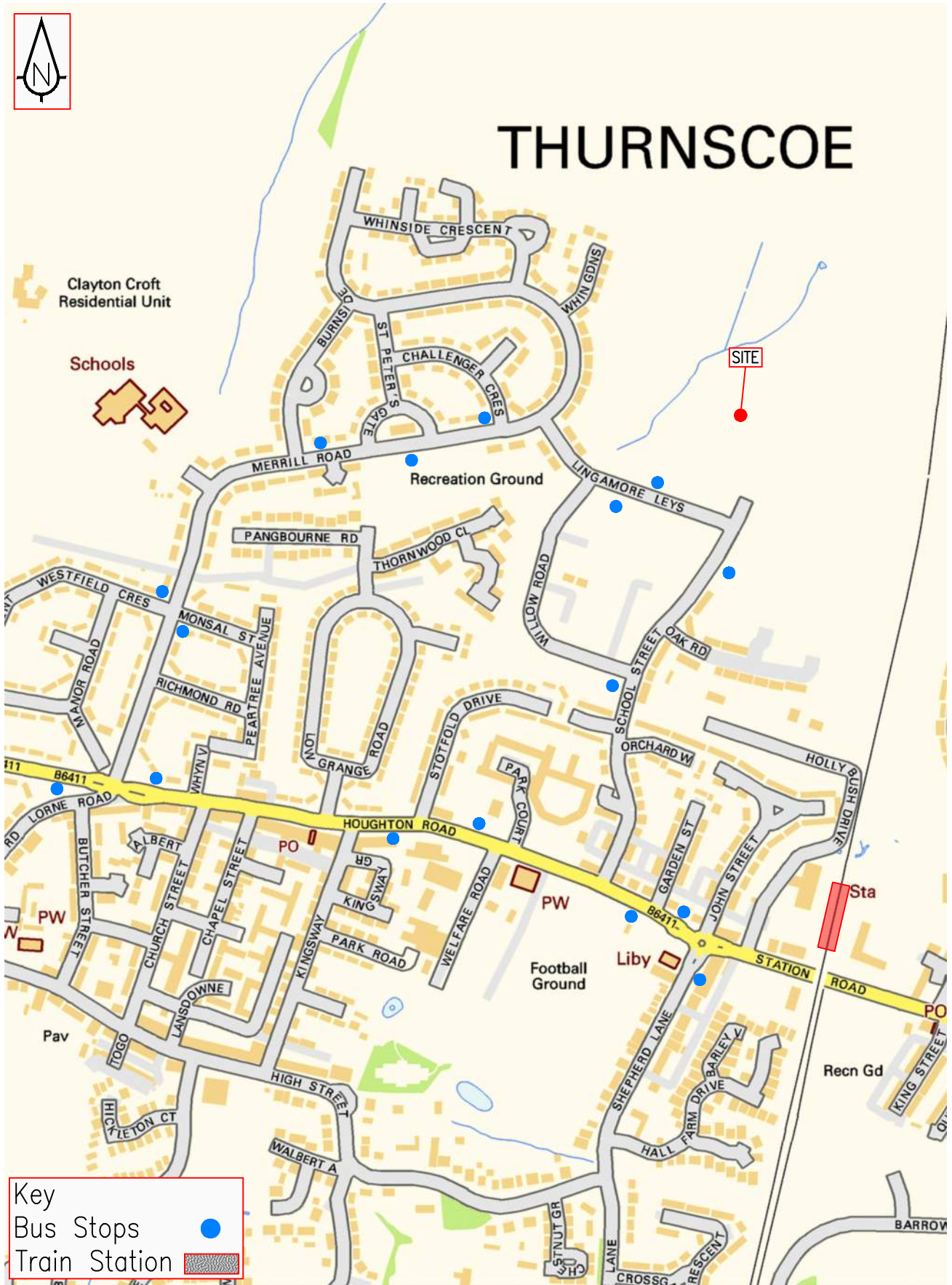
5km Indicative Cycling Distance
