TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREE PRESERVATION ORDER) REGULATIONS 1969

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby grants consent for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 31 May 2018 and therein described as:- Remove 5 sycamore trees (T1, T2, T4, T5, T6), retain Oak tree (T3) (amended proposal) 53 Wood Walk, Wombwell, Barnsley, S73 0NB.

Consent is subject to compliance with the following conditions:-

- 1 Within the first planting season the 5 Sycamore trees to be removed shall be replaced by 2 new Field Maple (*Acer campestre*) and 3 new English Oaks (*Quercus robur*). The new trees shall be planted within 1m of the removed tree they replace.

Specification: Standard sized trees (10-12cm girth) shall be planted and affixed (with flexible tree ties) to a tanalised tree stake (minimum diameter 75mm) at a height of no more than 1m above ground level. In order to aid establishment a suitable mulch shall be applied (e.g. semi-composted woodchip to a minimum depth of 75mm) around the tree to a radius of 1m. The trees shall be watered immediately after planting then whenever required to ensure successful establishment. Within two weeks of planting the Local Authority Tree officer shall be informed and invited to inspect the new trees. The new trees shall be subjected to a Tree Preservation Order in replacement of the felled trees. Any tree which fails to become established within 5 years from planting shall be replaced with another tree of the same original specification.

Reason: In the interests of the visual amenities of the locality.

- 2 Not less than five working days notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998.

Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice.

- 3 The proposed tree works should be completed within 2 years of the date of this consent.

Reason: To ensure the works accord with good arboricultural practice.

Pursuant to article 31(1)(cc) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with our Planning Service Charter for Business and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application.

- 1 Before proceeding with the notified works, you should ensure that you have the permission of the owner, and comply with all other relevant legislation, for example it is an offence to disturb nesting birds, and bat roosts.
