In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby refuses consent for the Display of internally illuminated double sided advertisement unit.
10 -12 Castle Close Monk Bretton Barnsley S71 QR
in accordance with the application form and accompanying plan(s) registered by the Council on 02 March 2010.

The reasons for the Council's decision to refuse consent are:-

- 1 In the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, the proposed display unit, by reason of its size and prominent position, together with the existing signs at the premises, will give rise to an excessive clutter of advertisements harmful to the appearance of the predominantly residential area. in addition the unit is not limited to that which is necessary to identify the premises and does not have regard to the site in which it is displayed. The proposal is therefore contrary to Policy BE6D of the approved Barnsley Unitary Development Plan and the Council's Supplementary Planning Guidance Note 8.

NOTES:-

1. If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the Local Planning Authority to refuse consent the applicant may within eight weeks of receipt of this notice, appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and Regions in accordance with Regulation 22 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1984. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of notice of appeal in cases where he is satisfied that the applicant has deferred the giving of notice because negotiations with the Local Planning Authority in regard to the proposed display are in progress.
