In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Regulations the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority hereby grants consent for the proposals the subject of the plan(s) and application registered by the Council on the 14 October 2016 and therein described as:- Crown lift Yew trees T1-T3 to 4m. Remove sycamore T4 and Laburnum T12. Crown lift Sycamore T5 to 6m. Prune to stump T6, crown reduce by 50% and crown lift to 4m Yew, Holly and Laurels T7-T11, T13 and T17. The Old School, Park Avenue, Wortley, Sheffield, S35 7DB.

Consent is subject to compliance with the following conditions:-

- 1 Not less than five working days notice of the date of the proposed work shall be given in writing to the Local Planning Authority for each phase of the works and the tree surgery shall be carried out to the standards set out in BS3998.  
**Reason: To ensure the work accords with good arboricultural practice.**
- 2 The proposed tree works should be completed within 5 years of the date of this consent.  
**Reason: To ensure that adequate notice is given for the works to be inspected and approved by the Local Planning Authority.**

*Pursuant to article 31(1)(cc) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with our Planning Service Charter for Business and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application.*

*Please be aware that the Council monitors construction sites and open land within the vicinity such sites in an attempt to prevent fly tipping (i.e. unauthorised deposit of waste on land), which is illegal under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. The penalties for fly-tipping can include:*

- *a fine of up to £50,000 and*
- *up to six months imprisonment on conviction*

*Therefore, if necessary, please ensure that all demolition waste and waste associated with the construction of the approved development is disposed of via approved methods and that documents are retained to prove this.*

- 1 Before proceeding with the notified works, you should ensure that you have the permission of the owner, and comply with all other relevant legislation, for example it is an offence to disturb nesting birds, bats and bat roosts.
