I strongly object to the completely unjustified decimation of Green Belt Land, in the area between Pogmoor, Dodworth, Redbrook, Barugh Green & Higham. Since 2014 there has been no "meaningful dialogue" between BMBC Planning Section and local residents. It has been merely a "checkbox" exercise to attempt to show the Planning Inspectorate that legislation has been complied with. This project despite the damaging implications it will have upon wildlife and the local environment, causing noise pollution, air pollution, anxiety and depression amongst the local residents. It will also have a detrimental impact upon the lives of the younger generation still to come. The whole development will completely destroy the character of the local area/landscape, "wildlife corridors" are another name for a "zoo" and different species of wildlife cannot thrive in it and will be lost forever, the much vaunted "green corridors" are already a "joke" in other developments and are totally inadequate to alleviate the problem of flooding and the overburdening of the "water-table", thousands of gallons of water already lie in the strata that was once the Barnsley Coalfield.
